Part 2. (a) Mandatory Orientation: Al Nasser Tower: This is proposed to be 8 eLearning modules that are defined by regulation, legislation policy and standards to be mandated education for all staff. See below. All modules will be assessed with on-line assessment

Part 2. (b) Mandatory Orientation: Sidra Hospital: This is proposed to be 11 eLearning modules that are defined by regulation, legislation policy and standards to be mandated education for all staff and 3 workshop sessions aimed at application of principles and standards. See below. All modules will be assessed with on-line assessment and classroom assessment for workshop assessment

Part 3. Role/department specific Orientation: The element of orientation is to be reviewed and agreed. Currently it is a proposal from OD&L.

- Proposal is that the role/department orientation is led by the department Line Manager as they are responsible for staff members performance and KPI's of the area
- Documentation is managed through the Learning Management System (LMS) using a checklist format (proposal)
- Check list (see draft attached) follows same Module Matrix as the mandatory program highlighted below, however, the topics of learning are identified by the department and aimed at meeting the mandatory needs of the department and role. Not a wish list of topics
- Management of the learning is guided / managed by the manager/educator/preceptor/mentor with the aim of completion at the end of probation.
- Registration of ALL Parts of Orientation (part 1,2,3) is recorded in the LMS and links to the individual staff members Performance Plan in Lawson's **ERP** system
- OD&L report against JCI standard on completion of Mandatory orientation
